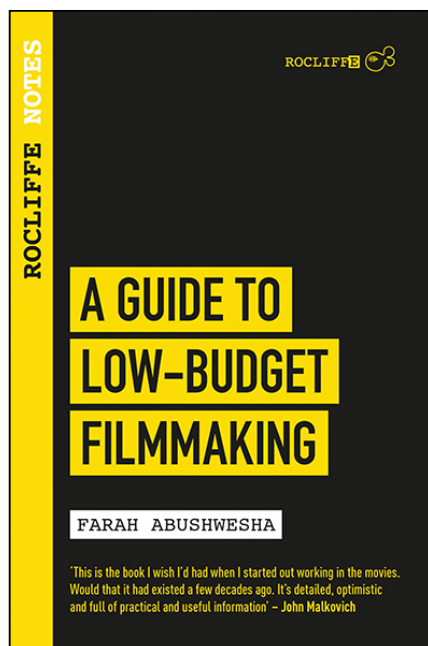

Her production work includes two acclaimed directorial debuts: BAFTA Breakthrough Brit Rowan Athale's *The Rise* and BAFTA nominee Tom Harper's *The Scouting Book for Boys*. Her short film *The Party* has been nominated for a 2017 BAFTA. Farah is the founder of the BAFTA Rocliffe New Writing Competition – the initiative behind the BAFTA and Rocliffe's FORUM LIST.
